Walk 2 Sgrìob gu Dùn an Sticir Wednesday 26 July, 2–3pm

This walk will explore the tidal Loch an Sticir and its three islands connected by artificial causeways. The eastern island features the remains of an Iron Age broch, built over in the 16th-century by a medieval hall, the home of the infamous Hugh MacDonald of Sleat. Meet: At the end of the road to Port nan Long, by the ruined crofts

Sgrìob gu Barpa Langais agus Pobull Fhinn Wednesday 9 August, 2–4pm

Wednesday 2 August, 2–3.30pm This walk will guide you from the site of St This walk will begin by walking up to Barpa Columba's Church to Clach an t-Sagairt the Langais, the best preserved Neolithic site of St Columba's Church and Druim na chambered cairn in the Outer Hebrides. We Croise. An extension to St Columba's Well may will climb to the trig point on Ben Langais above Pubull Fhinn and walk down to this Meet: On the grass beside the new Clachan stone circle erected around 2000BC. This walk offers spectacular views of Loch Langais and Loch Euphort. Meet: Barp car park

CEUT has risk assessed the walks. Some terrain will be uneven and possibly boggy. Anyone joining the walks does so at their own risk. You will require stout footwear and if you use walking poles, we suggest you bring them. Rainproof clothing is advised. Please bring your own water, snacks, sun/midge protection.
